

2026 No Limits “Two Blind Women in the Snowy Tokugawa Nights - Sleeping Fires” by Kuro Tanino

Trailer Descriptive Transcript

Cymbals clash and echoing voices chant over them, as indistinct blue and grey images flicker. Text on screen reads **Kuro Tanino. Two blind women in the snowy Tokugawa nights – Sleeping Fires**
